President's Welcome: Al Domscik opened the meeting thanking everyone for attending. Introduced new owners and first-time meeting attendees: Larry from Caribe Island, Kissandra and Thomas of Pelican Reef Villas & John and Buffy from Sun Bay. Al explained the February meeting was cancelled due to the date falling on Valentine's Day and March's meeting was moved to Monday due to scheduled events at SomePlace South Café Bar.

Al thanked the Patrol officers for their hard work and the owners of SomePlace South for hosting the meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Mary presented the Treasurer's Report. She announced the Kelly McGuire concert was a success, raising \$30,000, double from 2023. This increase was largely due to the addition of super bowl squares, live auction items, boozy woozy, the winner of the \$5k donating back, Kevin's hard work, Joe and Rhonda for hosting Kelly and the event. She reminded us although we have a cushion because of the event, SACNW has in excess of \$10,000 per month in expenses so

every donation annually, monthly or otherwise is very much welcome and she thanked everyone. If you have any questions concerning the financial report, Mary will be happy to discuss.

Severance for the patrolmen was discussed. All the patrolmen have over 10 years on the job, therefore, they are entitled to two weeks' pay for every year of service. Currently, funds are not earmarked for severance, nor is there a capital improvement fund for golf cart replacement when needed. Further discussion is needed on these two topics.

Security Report:

SACNW Patrol Josh Buettner presented the Security Report for September:

He reminded us that the meeting was set up to bring us together and help us get to know our neighbors. Patrol does an amazing job, is available for all kinds of emergencies and the Police are a super asset now as our patrolmen no longer have to leave the neighborhood to take anyone to the in-town police station.

10th 8:30am– Responded to complaints of 2 females having a verbal issue. The matter was turned over to police

17th 3;30am – removed a male and female person having fun in public area

17th 8:50pm - Detained an intoxicated male for harassing a tourist within the area

29th 5;50pm – Responded to worker who had fainted. RRR was called and worker taken to Polyclinic

- **Q.** What would happen if the SACNW was not here?
- **A.** Chaos would be back. SACNW provides peace of mind and assistance not only in emergencies but for general assistance.
- Q. What is the balance between patrol and police
- **A.** Patrol monitors and Police can take action. Patrol can identify everyone who lives here, Police goes by letter of the law. Assist residents and tourist and if there is a situation to monitor and contact proper authorities

- **Q.** Can injured people be transported to Ambergris Hope Hospital rather than Polyclinic?
- A. Yes, and they have been.
- Q. If I see something strange or suspicious should I call?
- **A.** Yes, please call and tell them what you see. They will respond as needed.

Fundraising – Kevin Owen presented

"Josh, Bob, Jerry. Joe and Rhonda were the founders of SACNW. They put this together at a time when caretakers carried guns and laws were not followed. When they set it up, people asked how can we help, what can be donated, and back then \$3500 bzd worked. Today, the yearly budget is \$200K. No-one other than the patrolmen are financially compensated for their involvement in the organization. He presented a board, which showed a list of donors from 2022 – 2023. Some people are not individually mentioned as they donate through their resort HOA fees. He encouraged everyone to take a look – if you are donating and don't see your name, talk to us; if you don't see a neighbor or friend, encourage them to support the patrolmen. If you personally aren't contributing, please let us know why so we can address your concerns.
